Uniform Policy

Our uniform is an important part of our school identity and we expect parents to support our high expectations.

School Uniform Rationale:

We believe that the wearing of school uniform promotes:

- A feeling of belonging
- A pride in our appearance and of our school

Aims:

- To encourage all children to take a pride in their appearance and our school identity and to look as smart as possible.
- To ensure that the children dress in a way which ensures their safety and that of others, particularly physical activity.
- To ensure parents are aware of school expectations regarding uniform.

All children are expected to wear the correct school uniform. It is not mandatory for uniform to have the school logo on it.

- Grey or black skirt, trousers, shorts or pinafore dress
- White or light blue blouse, shirt or polo shirt
- Royal blue cardigan / sweater or school sweatshirt
- Summer blue and white gingham dress

SUITABLE SHOES SHOULD BE WORN AT ALL TIMES

For reasons of hygiene and safety, the wearing of plimsolls, trainers, or open-toed, sling-back sandals as everyday 'school shoes' will not be permitted. Similarly, unsuitably high heeled shoes are not appropriate. If boots or wellingtons are worn in bad weather, children need school shoes to change into for indoors.

PE

All year groups: plimsolls (or trainers for outdoor PE).

Royal blue shorts, light blue or white t-shirts (school t-shirts available)

Navy blue or black tracksuit bottoms in the winter months. PE is taught outside all year round. PE kit should be worn to school on the day of the PE lesson and children remain in them all day. We do not allow the wearing of jewellery (apart from single simple sleepers or studs in pierced ears). Children must be able to remove their own earrings for PE or wear tape to cover them. The school will take no responsibility for the loss or damage of any such items brought to school. Long hair must be tied back in PE lessons.

Monitoring

It is the class teacher's responsibility to monitor uniform and discuss anything that is inappropriate with parents. If the matter cannot be resolved, an official uniform letter will be sent out stating the uniform issue and when it needs to be addressed by. If parents are having financial difficulties where uniform is concerned, they can seek support through by contacting the school office. The Headteacher will publish annually on our website, a full list of requirements. Any significant change to this list will be approved by governors. If any pupil is inappropriately dressed, parents will be contacted and children asked to change.
