Curriculum Overview – Year 2

Reading

Reading lessons

We teach reading as a whole class twice weekly, focusing on comprehension and vocabulary.

Phonics

During our daily phonics lessons, we will continue to develop our understanding of blending and segmenting skills and will learn the new sounds, spelling patterns and words associated with the Twinkl Phonics Scheme level 6a. Assessments in phonics will be ongoing and interventions will be implemented at the teacher's discretion.

English

Talk for Writing

Key texts and story types we will explore for writing:

- The Witches' Spell – William Shakespeare – Poetry
- The Pumpkin that spoke – Journey story
- Making Soup - instructions
- James and the Great Fire – Defeating the monster
- Samuel Pepys' Diary – recount

Handwriting

We will begin our learning of joined up handwriting and focus on written presentation across the curriculum.

Maths

The units of work covered this term are:

Number

- Place Value
- Addition and subtraction

Geometry

- Shape names and properties of 2D and 3D shapes

We will focus on quick mental recall of addition and subtraction facts of numbers below 20, as well as counting in 2s, 5s and 10s.

We always look for opportunities to use the skills learnt in Maths across the curriculum.

Science

Autumn 1 – Everyday materials

- Identify and compare materials
- Investigate uses of materials
- Explore how shapes of solids can be changed

Autumn 2 – Living things and habitats

- Explore and compare differences between things that are living, dead and have never been alive
- Identify habitats and basic needs.
